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World Mental Health Day – Friday 10 October

Parents and carers may be aware that tomorrow marks World Mental Health Day. Connected with this event, Public Health England (PHE) Better Health – Every Mind Matters campaign provides NHS-endorsed tips and advice to help children and young people's mental wellbeing, and equip parents and carers with the knowledge to support them. The advice above has been developed in partnership with leading children and young people's mental health charities, including Young Minds, The Mix, Place2Be and The Anna Freud Centre. It is designed to help parents and carers spot the signs that children may need support with their mental health, and also provides advice that can help maintain good mental wellbeing. The site also provides tools to help young people build resilience and equips them to look after their mental wellbeing.

Here in school, we link this focus both to the school's Learning for Life (L4L; see attachment – we're all aiming to be in the 'green zone'!) and to our simple school rules and motto of 'Aiming High & Having Fun!', emphasising to the children the importance of enjoyment and fun within school for our well-being.
