Reading:

- Listen to and discuss a wide range of bonfire/firework-themed poems, stories and non-fiction books.

- Learn to appreciate rhymes and songs and recite/sing some by heart.

Writing:

- Sequence the Guy Fawkes story.
- Use full stops at the end of sentences.
- Start to use capital letters at the start of sentences.
- Write fireworks words using onomatopoeia.
- Use adjectives to describe the properties of everyday materials.
- Begin to use suffixes (-ing).
- Write simple sentences in focused tasks.

History

- Learn about historical figures and events – Guy Fawkes and the Gunpowder Plot.
